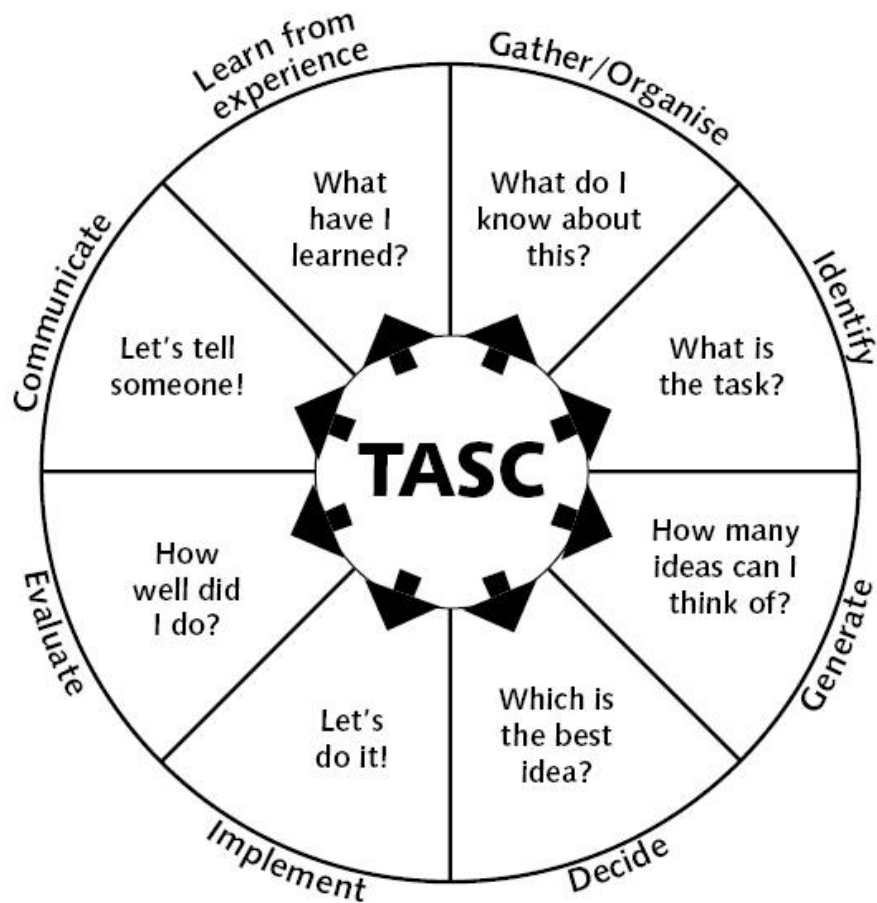


TASC: Thinking Actively in a Social Context

The TASC Problem-solving Wheel



Children can cut and laminate the TASC Wheel and fasten it with paper-fasteners into an exercise book or thinking skills log-book. Better still, pupils can redesign the TASC Wheel and invent their own symbols for each stage of the Problem-solving Wheel. Then pupils can use the whole Wheel to guide their thinking and planning. It's a good idea to ask pupils to keep a portfolio of their best work which provides examples of the strategies they have used in developing their project. Importantly, the Problem-solving Process must be used across the curriculum whenever it is appropriate.
